3) Map data

This map and the related information on the following pages were supplied by the British Library.

The map, from the N.W. Frontier Province series, shows Jamrud and the Khyber route and includes three different types of territory, Peshawar District, Khyber Agency, and Mohmand Country. The back history of the sheet is interesting, because it demonstrates the differences in available data for British districts and tribal territory, invokes the Trans-frontier series as smaller-scale elements in the history, and picks up the 1860s N.W. Frontier Revenue Survey 1-inch maps as a source.

The two following pages contain an extract from Dr. Andrew S. Cook's unpublished 'quad histories' of Survey of India topographical map sheets. The entries simultaneously demonstrate the meticulousness of his work and suggest the extent of the British Library's holdings of editions and printings. The left column contains the pressmarks for sheets in the former India Office Records collections. The entry in bold face describes the map below.
